If you are:

Female (at birth) and under 25
-orMale (at birth) and under 19

you may have missed the vaccine at school.

HPV stands for Human Papillomavirus.

It is very common and most sexually active people will be exposed to HPV virus.

Most HPV infections have no symptoms and go away on their own, but some cause <u>genital warts</u> & others can <u>increase your risk of cancers</u> later in life such as:

- cervical cancer
- some mouth & throat cancers
- cancers of the genital/ anal area.

The vaccine helps to protect you from being infected by HPV.
