secondary schools and colleges. This can either be in assembly, or if there are groups of young people identified at being at risk of or who are using substances, they can deliver group sessions. Some schools have asked UTurn to deliver drop-in sessions and this has been successful.

#LookCloser week of action Monday 4 March



Healthy Start digital cards and vitamins



If you're pregnant or have a child under the age of 4, you could be eligible for the NHS Healthy Start Scheme



To check if you're eligible for Healthy Start, visit: www.healthystart.nhs.uk

NHS Healthy Start helps young families and those who are more than 10 weeks pregnant to access healthy food, milk and vitamins.

Eligibility for the scheme also depends on the benefit the person receives and what their income is.

Once on the scheme, people will get:

- £4.25 each week of their pregnancy (from the 10th week of pregnancy)
- £8.50 each week for children from birth to one year old
- £4.25 each week for children between one and four years old
- Women's vitamins for those who are pregnant or have a child up to one year old
- Children's vitamin drops for children up to four years old.
