News

Two related consultations: school accountability reform and improving the way Ofsted inspects education

You may want to respond to these consultations and share them with parents and carers.

Plans unveiled by the Education Secretary in February aim to invest in new regional improvement teams, known as RISE teams which will prioritise "stuck" schools. They will draw up bespoke improvement plans with those schools, with government making up to £100,000 available initially to each school for specialist support.

Chameleon PDE free resources for primary schools



Chameleon PDE is developing PSHE 'wrap around support' for primary schools. This includes fully editable PSHE lesson packs, staff CPD and a pupil survey. Lessons are around 30 minutes long. Chameleon is working with primary schools including one in Swindon to trial new material. Their current primary school library includes around 90 lessons, which will be updated to reflect their new styling and multi-media options. Chameleon PDE legacy pricing extended for Swindon's secondary schools

Following the 'Raising Aspirations' programme where secondary schools had access to the Chameleon PDE resource library, several Swindon secondary schools have taken advantage of their legacy pricing offer which is a 50% saving on the annual licence price. The pricing model will change after Easter. However, any school in Swindon subscribing before 30 March 2025 can take advantage of this discount. New resources include more video and recorded material, new look teacher notes, example schemes of work and accredited CPD opportunities.

Report Remove tool

When a young person loses control of a nude image of themselves, it can be very distressing. It's important that young people don't feel judged when this happens and you should reassure them that they haven't done anything wrong. You should also follow your school's child protection procedures.

You can also help a young person aged under 18 to use the Report Remove tool to see if the image or video can be taken down, and Childline can provide further support.
